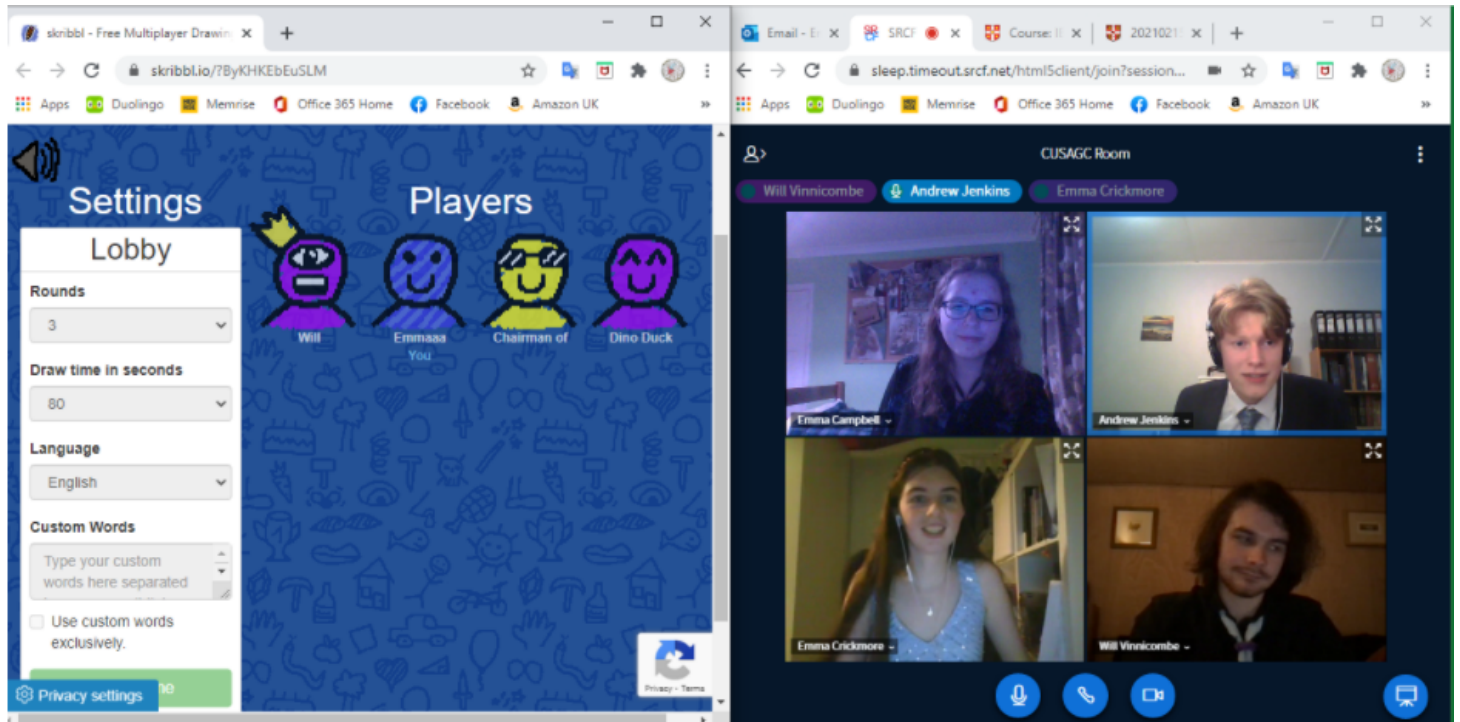

Looking Forward

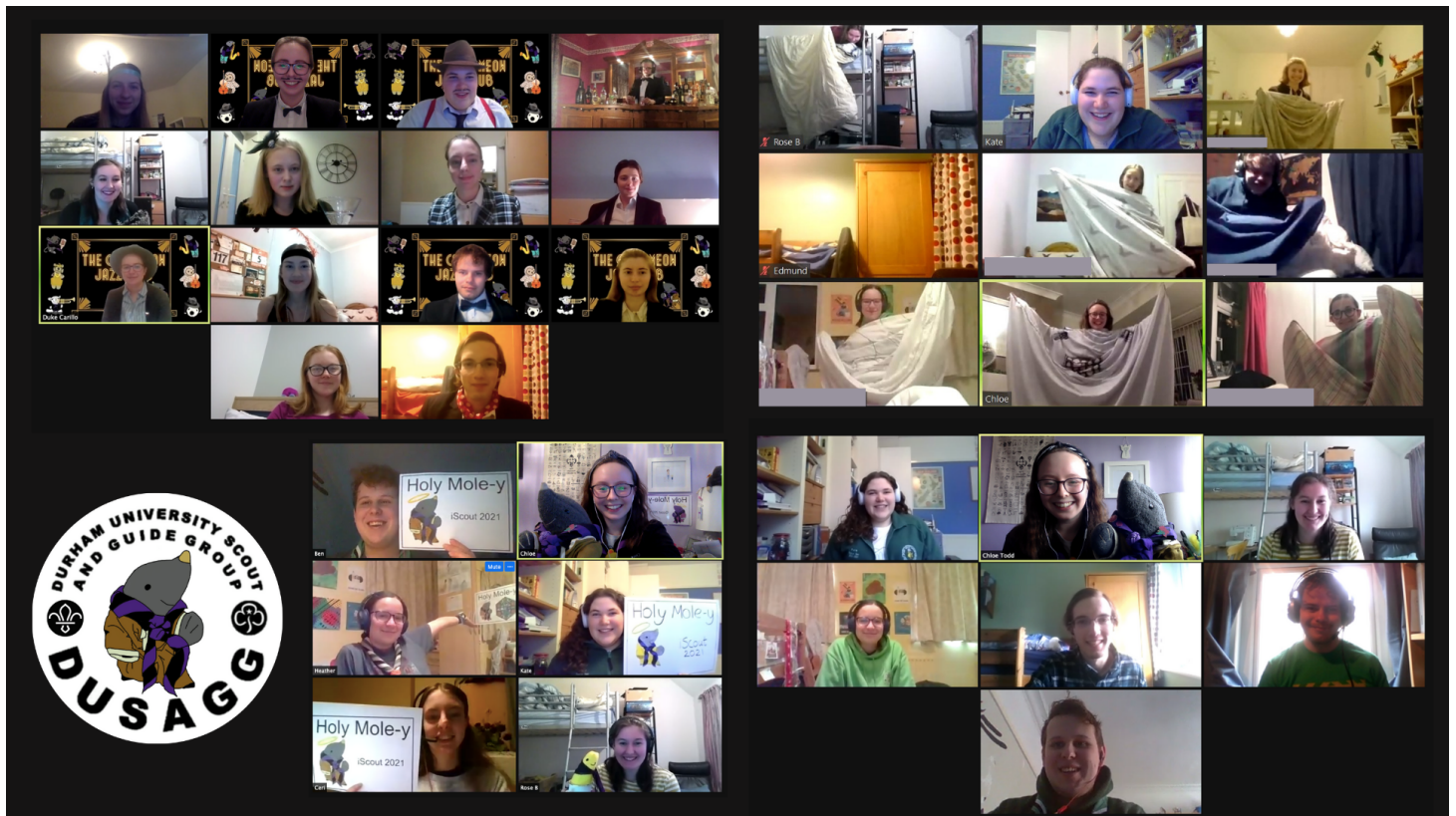

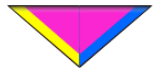
This term the group has not been up to much due to deadlines and lower than hoped engagement from the student body. This is likely due to everything being shifted online.

Looking Forward

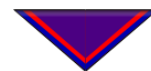

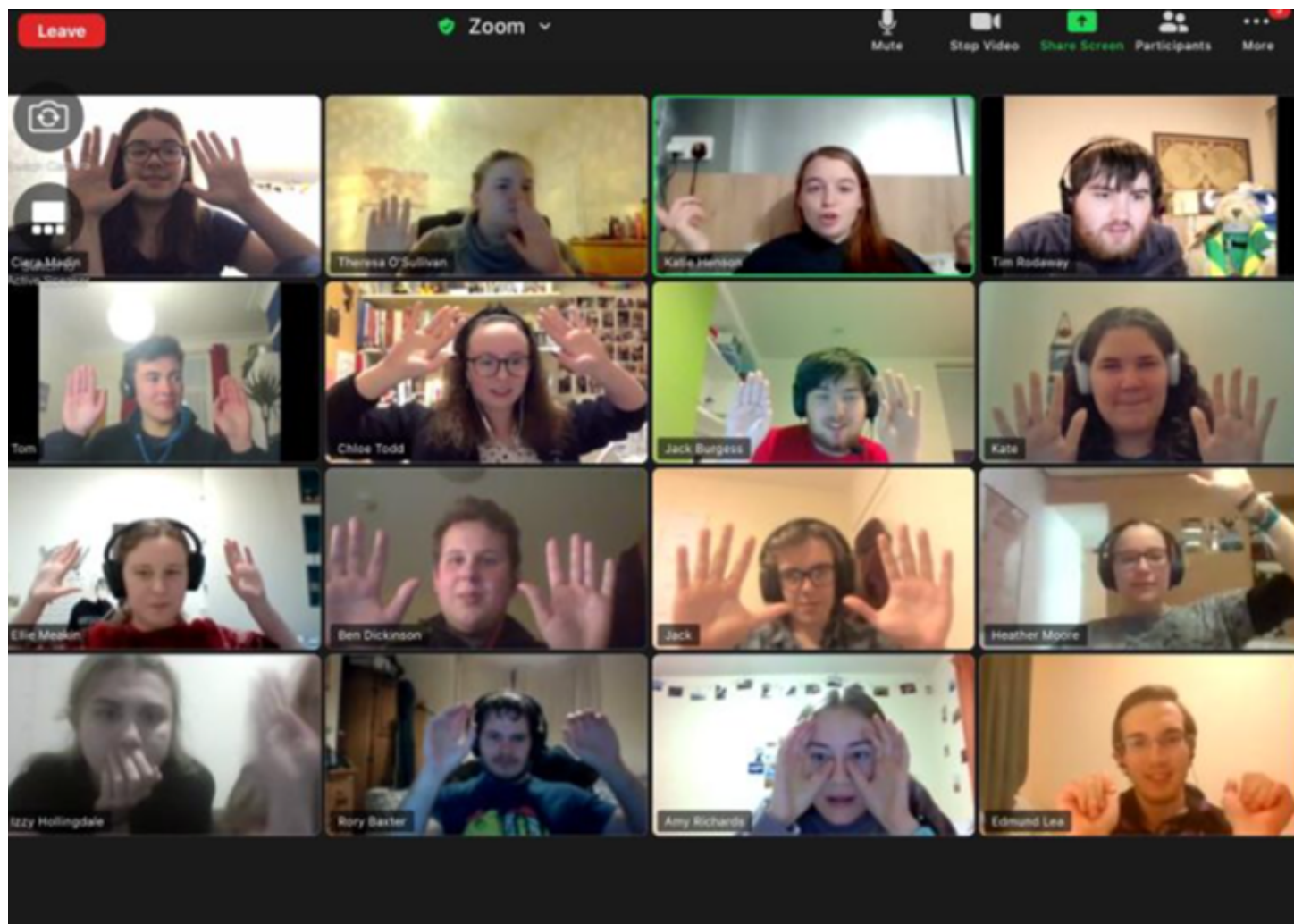
Looking Forward

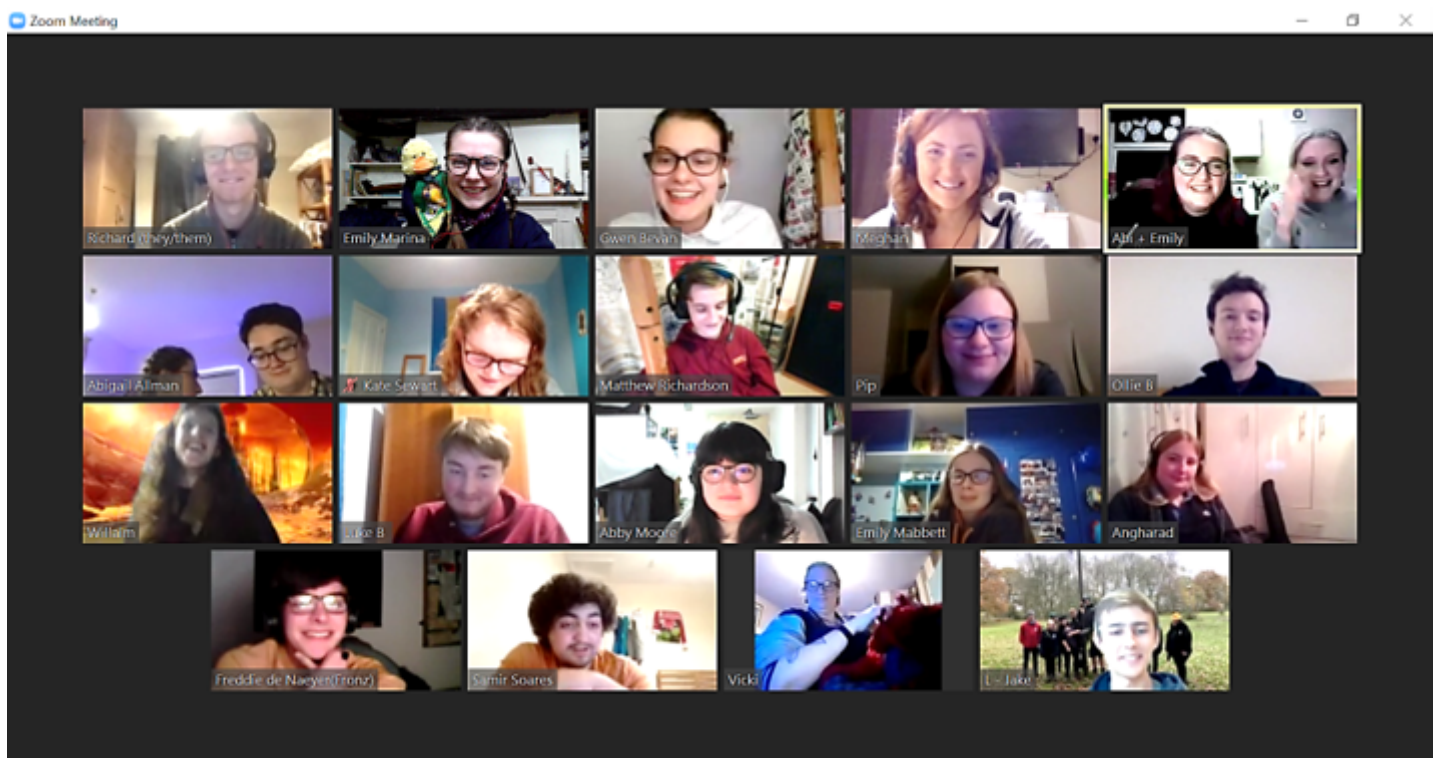

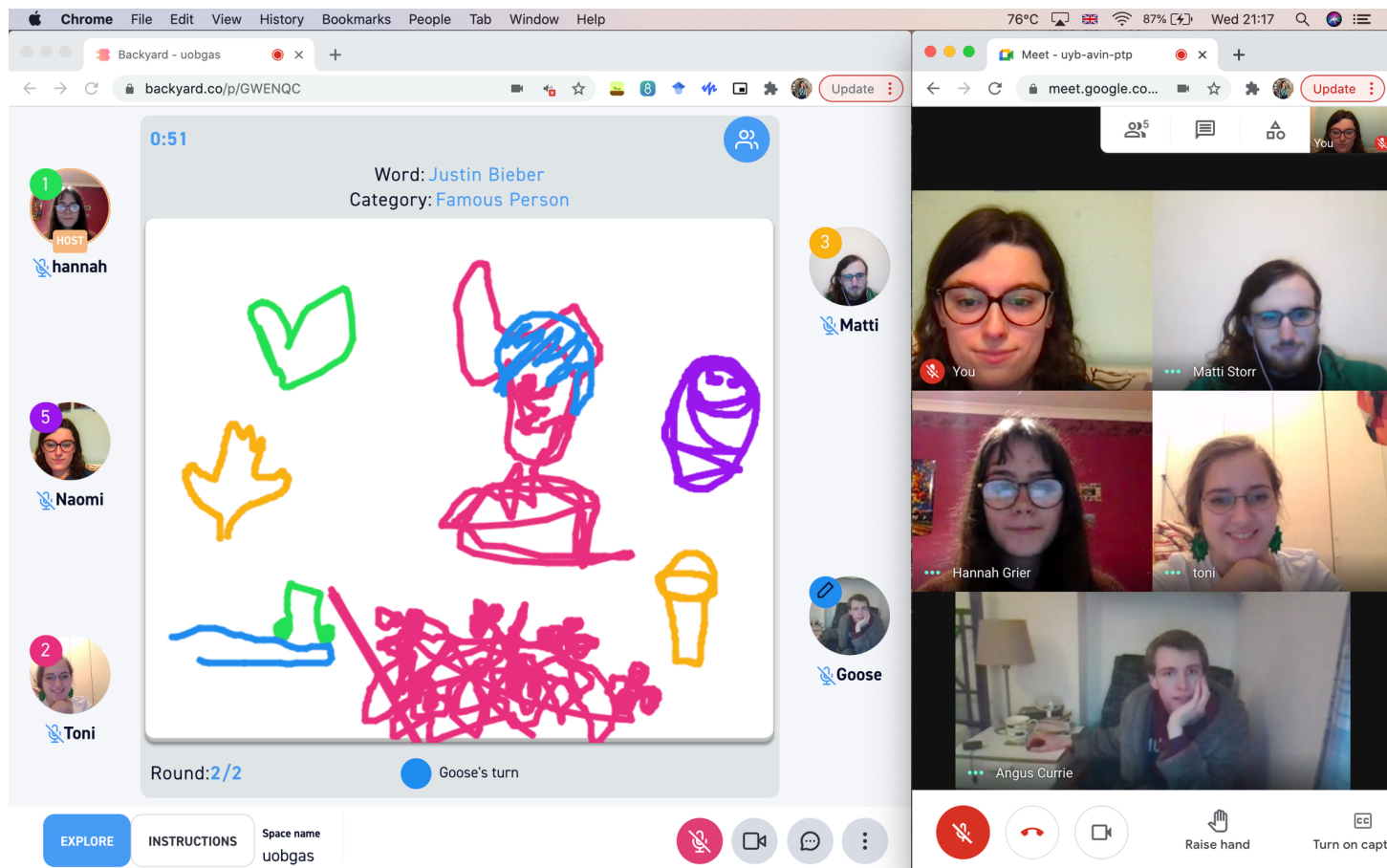

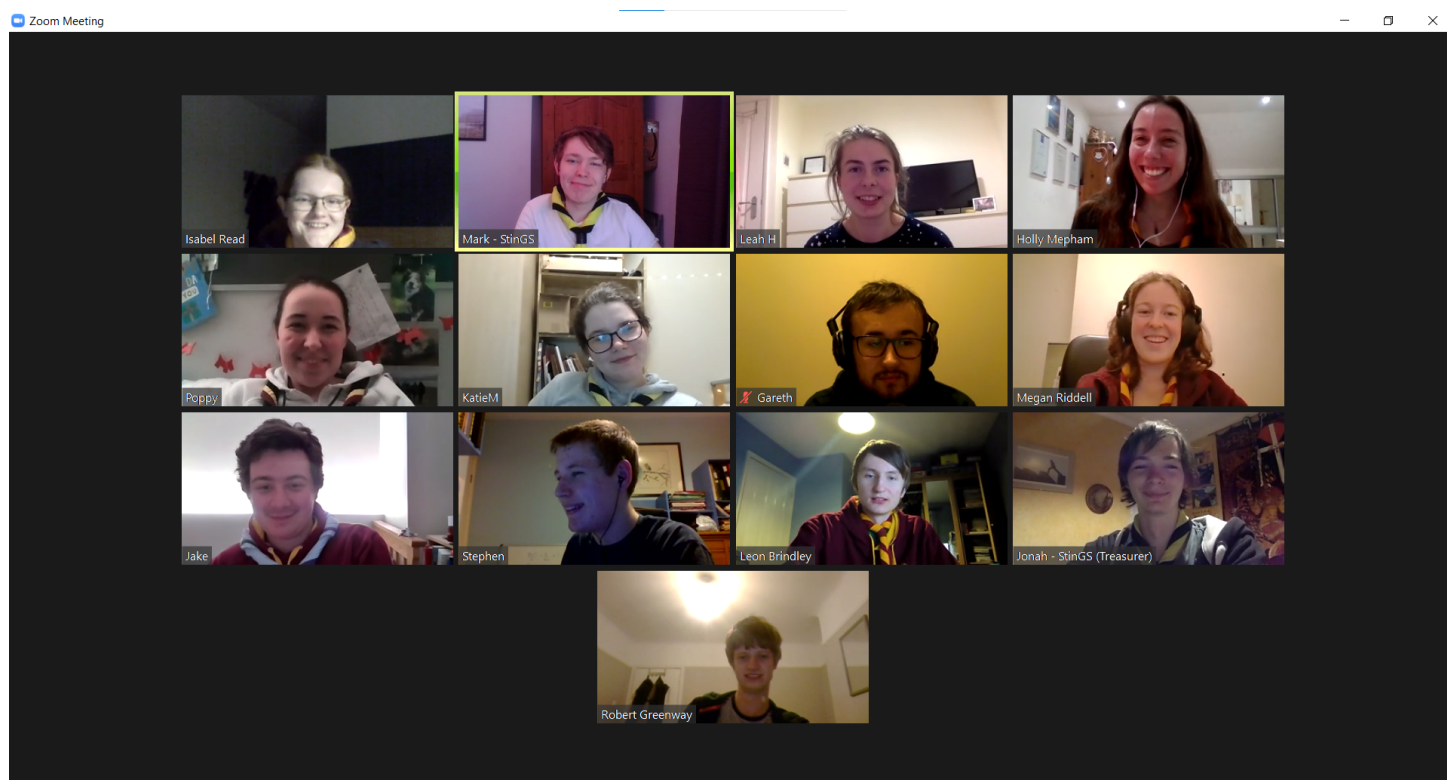
